

Dear Precious Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Through my daily devotions, I have begun again to read through the New Testament. Looking again at the teachings of the Lord in the many parables is always eye opening. It always amazes me how relevant God's word is to my life. When I reached chapter 13 on the parable of the mustard seed, it brought me such joy.

Although this tiny parable has great meaning relating to the Kingdom of God and faith in His work, I could not help but think how this relates to each of us. Please permit me to share a small portion of my joy from this great truth. Luke 13:18, Jesus said, "What is the Kingdom of God like? And to what shall I compare it? It is like a mustard seed, which a man took and put in his garden; and it grew and became a large tree, and the birds of the air nested in its branches."



As I read those words, I was reminded of something Ray Jones alluded to many years ago (Ray is the man who first took Ed, a new believer, under his wings to disciple him at First Baptist Kenner, LA). Describing how the Lord has worked in this Ministry, he said he had discipled many people through his Christian life, just as someone had invested the word of God in him. All of which grow in different ways and different measures. But how thankful he was to see that the Lord had taken Ed and the gospel seed planted in him and was raising it into a large tree where others could nest in its branches. Thinking of how God has chosen to build His Kingdom is an indescribable blessing. Our Lord desires to take one insignificant grain of a tiny mustard seed (an individual saved by His

unsurpassed power of the Gospel, and use it to extend His Kingdom. It is always astounding when God grants His mercy and grace to anyone! Notwithstanding, He will then utilize that one seed in His kingdom-building.

Notice how the gift of faith is employed in this work. This one, by faith, takes the seed (the Gospel seed) and plants it in his garden. By faith, we are to sow the right seed and nurture it to produce fruit. Believers are to live and plant the truth of God's word, having the promise that fruit will come from His word and work and that fruit will remain.

As I pondered this truth, I was filled with praise and thanksgiving for all the work the Lord has done and continues to do through a seed planted so many years ago. That seed has grown into a beautiful tree where others can find the truth of the Gospel. Then, others can come alongside and receive hope and shelter in times of distress and help to plant their gardens with the seed of the Good News of Jesus Christ. Moreover, this caused me to think of each of you who have come alongside us as co-laborers in the field. You have been with us, watering and helping others to sow the Gospel seed in other gardens. As Paul said in I Corinthians, he who plants and the ones who water are one. It seemed improbable when Jesus spoke of the tremendous harvest produced from the mustard seed, the tiniest seed in man's eyes. Yet, the confidence in our planting and watering comes because the seed of the Gospel is in the hands of our Savior and Lord, who alone gives the increase.

#### 2023 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Last month, we held the yearly board meeting for Ed Lacy Ministries, Inc. We are incredibly blessed to have such devoted servants of the Lord to serve on our board. A few members could not attend due to health reasons or a scheduling conflict with a mission trip. 
#### LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

I will also soon be a part of the prison ministry and, Lord willing, a Bible study that ministers to recovering addicts and alcoholics. Your giving frees me up to do much while I continue my studies here. I am greatly indebted to you and so thankful for your generous decision to give – and even more so for your prayers. May the Lord continue to bless this ministry and make His name great through His servants.

#### ZIMBABWE PASTOR

Andisive B Hadebe, known as 'The Pastor of the City Dump'. He goes by, Andie. He and his wife Ntombi are a young, vibrant couple serving the Lord in Zimbabwe. They desire to bring the gospel of Jesus Christ to the lost, wherever they are. When their church issued the need for someone to reach out in a very impoverished area, they answered that call.

The area is in Ngozi Mine, approximately 17 kilometers outside Bulawayo, which is the city dump. A large population of roughly 200 underprivileged families has settled in this location. They find their income by recycling waste material from the dumping area. The challenges they incur include high illiteracy, especially among adults, alcoholism, drugs, teen pregnancy, and extreme poverty. Yet, Andie and others have been willing to go with the Good News of the Gospel, whereas others may not be willing to serve under these conditions. Their motto is:

### "BUILDING A PEOPLE OF POWER - MAKING A PEOPLE OF PRAISE."

One of our board members continues to work with this group when he travels to Zimbabwe. Zimbabwe has a bleak economic outlook, with an inflation rate of over 132%. Therefore, our prayers and financial help in this mission work are a great aid and resource to these workers in the garden.

Since our last newsletter, the Lord has kept me extremely busy, for which I am thankful. Already, I have shared about the ministry board meeting. Next, was the ladies' conference at First Baptist Demopolis, AL. I had such an enjoyable and receptive time with this precious group of women. This was the first time this church has held a ladies' conference, and I count it a privilege to share in what will hopefully begin a fruitful women's ministry. Our theme for the weekend was 'Radiant' taken from Psalm 34. We delved into the background of this Psalm, which makes the meaning of the word radiant something valuable and encouraging. The next morning, we looked at 2 Corinthians 3:18, 'Beholding our God'.

Additionally, in the ladies' class at my home church, we have taught through the book of Jude. Those 25 verses are packed with weighty and needed truths for our day. Also, I am blessed to work with our ladies' ministry at church. Moreover, I am diligently working on the finishing touches for the evangelism book. I await the outcome from the precious couple reviewing and critiquing the book. Preliminary updates from them have been very positive and encouraging. I will contact an editor and publisher upon their completion, after considering their suggestions. Please continue to pray for this endeavor. The need is great, and the truths of this study will be able to help many. Even now, one of the board members is utilizing Christ-centered Evangelism in the training of 40-50 pastors. We are praying that the Lord will saturate their hearts with the Gospel.
