MATTHEW 5:3

BLESSED – (SUPREMELY HAPPY) – ARE THE POOR IN SPIRIT, FOR THEIRS IS THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN.

1.	The word "poor" in the physical realm, describes someone who is reduced to destitution.
2.	The Lord Jesus is describing a person who has come to recognize and declare their spiritual, in the presence of Holy God.
3.	To be "poor in spirit" is the opposite of being rich in pride, self-righteousness, self-reliance and sufficiency.
4.	He recognizes his spiritual poverty to such a degree, that the only thing that he can do is take the place of a destitute, desperate and dependent before God.
5.	He realized that he is in desperate need of the :
	A. The of God – that God would <u>not</u> give him what he does deserve.

	B. The of God – that God would give him what he does <u>not</u> deserve.
6.	The great tragedy is that the vast majority of people are spiritually destitute, but they don't it.
	Church of Laodicea – <u>Revelation 3:17</u> – "Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing' – and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked"
	Luke 18:11-14 – The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, "God, I thank You that I am not like other men - extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess." And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, "God, be merciful to me a sinner!"
